

National Survey of Children with Special Health Care Needs (NS-CSHCN), 2001

OUR QUESTION:

How does caring for CYSHCN, especially those whose health needs are more complex or severe, affect the work life of employed family members?

WHAT WE CAN LEARN FROM THE DATA:

- 1. How many CYSHCN ages 0-17 live in Washington State? (Data query #1)
 - There are about 210,000 CSHCN in Washington State
- 2. How many CYSHCN in Washington State have one or more family members who cut down on their work hours to care for the child's special health need? (*Data query #1*)
 - 25.7% CYSHCN in Washington State have one or more family members who cut down on hours worked to care for the child's special health needs
 - The 95% confidence interval for the estimated 25.7% of CYSHCN in WA with one or more family members who cut back on work hours is 21.9% 29.4% or (+/- 3.8 pts)
 - This translates into between **46,000 and 62,000 CYSHCN*** in Washington State with one or more family members who cut back on hours worked in order to care for the child's special health care needs.
- 3. How do parents in Washington State rate the severity of their CYSHCN's health conditions? (*Data query #2*)

Mild (0 – 2)	27.2%
Moderate (3 – 6)	51.6%
Severe/Most Severe (7 – 10)	21.2% (17.1% + 4.1%)

4. In Washington State, do family members of CYSHCN whose conditions are more complex or severe have a greater likelihood of cutting down on the number of hours worked to care for child than do family members of CYSHCN with less complex or severe health conditions? (*Data query #3*)

 How <u>much more likely</u> than CYSHCN whose health conditions are described as "moderate" are CYSHCN with "severe or most severe" health conditions to have 1 or more family members who cut back hours worked in order to care for child's health needs?

A)	44.3% (Severe & cut back) 25.7% (Moderate & cut back)	=	1.7 times more likely to have family members cut back hours worked to care for child
B)	48.2% (Most severe & cut back) 25.7% (Moderate & cut back)	=	1.9 times more likely to have family members cut back hours worked to care for child

"<u>TELLING THE STORY</u>":

According to the 2001 National Survey of CSHCN:

- 1 in 4 CYSHCN in Washington State have at least one family member who has cut back on number of hours worked in order to care for the child's special needs.
- This translates into an estimated 46,000 to 62,000 CYSHCN in Washington State with one or more family members who cut back on the number of hours worked due to the demands of caring for the child's health needs.
- The work life of Washington State families with CYSHCN whose health conditions are more complex or severe is disproportionately affected by the care giving demands of having a child with special health care needs:
 - Washington State CYSHCN with more severe or complex health conditions are nearly twice as likely to have one or more family members who cut back on hours worked to care for child's health needs than are CYSHCN with health conditions ranked as "moderate." (44.3 / 25.7; 48.2 / 25.7)
 - Although only 21% of CYSHCN in Washington State have health conditions described as "severe or most severe," they account for nearly 40% of the 46,000 to 62,000 CYSHCN with at least one family member who cut back on number of hours worked in order to care for the child's health needs. (20,010 / 52,784)
